Term: Spring 1

Theme: Animal Allsorts

On this page you will find an outline of our learning this half term in Seedlings Class.

Number and Place Value within 20

We will explore teen numbers using ten frames and tens and ones models, understanding that teen numbers are made up of a ten and extra ones. We will count forwards and backwards within 20, finding 1 more and 1 less. We will order and compare numbers within 20.

Mathematics Addition and Subtraction within 20

This term we will learn how to add and subtract within 20 using a range of strategies such as by counting on/back, using number bonds, using number lines, and making 10 first.

Science: Animals including humans.

We'll be using observation skills to compare and contrast animals and identify their category: mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians, fish. Then we'll group them into carnivore, herbivore and omnivore. Humans are animals too! We'll learn about parts of the body and explore our senses.




Art & Design: 3D Sculpture



We'll be looking at sculptures and finding out how artists use different materials to make a 3D sculpture. We will try different skills and techniques to make paper 3D, and will create a paper sculpture of a bird.

English

We will be looking at the story "Stella and the Seagull" by Georgina Stevens. We will continue writing simple dictated sentences using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. We will begin to write our own ideas for simple sentences using different adjectives and verbs to describe the animals and beach setting.



We will begin learning how to use capital letters for names, and learn how to use s and es to show plurals. We will also begin to learn different word endings such as y and ing.

Computing: Programming

We'll be using Beebots to understand basic programming.

Religious Education:

What do Christians believe God is like? We will learn about what different stories from the Bible teach Christians.

RHSE: Caring for others – Our Special People

We will explore why they are special and how they care for and keep one another safe.
