Mathematics:

Multiplication and division

- Mental calculations, including with mixed operations and large numbers
- Formal calculation methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division (including long multiplication and short division)
- Use knowledge of the order of operations to carry out calculations involving the 4 operations

Outcome: To write a story about overcoming a monster Grammar:


- semi-colons to mark boundaries between clauses
- hyphens to avoid ambiguity
- expand noun phrases to convey complicated information concisely



Outcome: To write a poem describing a special place and events

Grammar:

- adverbials (revision Y4).
- semi-colons, colons or dashes to mark boundaries between main clauses





Fractions, Decimals and Percentages

- use common factors to simplify fractions; use common multiples to express fractions in the same denomination
- compare and order fractions, including fractions >1
- add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers, using the concept of equivalent fractions
- multiply simple pairs of proper fractions, writing the answer in its simplest form [for example, $1/4 \times 1/2 = 1/8$]
- divide proper fractions by whole numbers [for example, $1/3 \div 2 = 1/6$]
- identify the value of each digit in numbers given to 3 decimal places and multiply and divide numbers by 10, 100 and 1,000 giving answers up to 3 decimal places
- multiply one-digit numbers with up to 2 decimal places by whole numbers
- use written division methods in cases where the answer has up to 2 decimal
- solve problems which require answers to be rounded to specified degrees of accuracy
- recall and use equivalences between simple fractions, decimals and percentages, including in different contexts
