Car Parking

Please, please, please can I ask everyone to continue to be considerate about how and where they park, particularly at the end of the day. <u>Headlice</u>

A matter that occasionally arises in our school community—headlice. As you may know, these tiny critters can affect children of all ages, and although they are not a health hazard, they can certainly be a nuisance.

We have noticed a slight increase in cases recently, and it's important for us to work together to manage this issue effectively. To help mitigate the spread, we kindly ask that you check your child's hair regularly, especially if they are itching or scratching. Early detection can make all the difference in controlling the situation.

If you do find headlice, there are various treatments available, ranging from over-thecounter lotions to prescription treatments. It's essential to follow the instructions on whichever product you choose. Remember to check the entire family and repeat the treatment as advised, as it may take more than one application to completely eliminate the lice and their eggs.

<u>Swimming – rapidly approaching – Y5 and Y6</u>



We are really pleased that we will be able to take our Y5 children (Red Oaks) swimming in over a two-week block – week beginning **18th November and 25th November**. The children will swim every afternoon at Truro Leisure Centre and will be taught by trained swimming instructors. We will travel by coach each

day and hope that parents/carers will be able contribute towards the cost of transport through ParentPay.

The children will need a swimming hat, goggles and a towel for these sessions.
