In key stage 2 assembly this week we explored two key values, tolerance and diversity, discussing how both of them are important and contribute to the vibrancy of the world we live in. We started with a game (virtually) comparing our differing preferences for things: from red or blue, football or ruby, through to ketchup or mayonnaise. We





then talked about how we can show



#### Times Tables

A quick and automatic recall of times tables is key building block for children in mathematics. Regular practice of these with your children really does make a difference and overtime will help to improve their confidence in all areas of mathematics. The Oxford

Children in key stage 2 also have access to **Times Tables Rockstars** which is great way to practice in a fund way.

#### COVID

From today, 1<sup>st</sup> April, the guidance surrounding COVID-19 is changing. For the majority of the population the free universal offer of testing will end. Although the updated guidance has not yet been issued it will outline an intent to treat infections in the way that any other respiratory infections are dealt with. Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.
