 Mathematics This term we will focus on learning all about subtraction, the inverse of addition and subtraction and money: 2 digit number and ones 2 digit number and tens Subtracting on a number line (formal method) not crossing tens and then crossing tens Problem solving involving subtraction recognise and use symbols for pounds (£) and pence (p); combine amounts to make a particular value find different combinations of coins that equal the same amounts of money solve simple problems in a practical context involving addition and subtraction of money of the same unit, including giving change Continuing to learn, recall and recite number bonds to 20 and 100 and times tables: 2x,3x,5x,10x. 		 History: How has life at the seaside changed? We will be comparing seaside holidays in the past and what has changed. We will become historical detectives, using photographs and artefacts to help us to find clues about what happened. Geography: We will be developing our locational knowledge. In particular, identify Cornwall on a map of the UK. We will explore the human and physical features of the seaside with a focus on Marazion and St Michaels Mount. We will study the features of the seaside and answer the question: What would we see at the seaside? We will learn about the 7 continents and 5 oceans. Science: Living things and their habitats We will be exploring and comparing differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive. We will understand different habitats, micro-habitats and learn about simple food chains. Art & Design: We are exploring the work from Marela Zacarias to learn about expressive painting and how to mix colours to creature texture and intentionally mark making to create landscapes. 				
English Fiction/ Non-fiction: In English we will be reading the story 'The Snail and the Whale' by Julia Donaldson. We will develop our reading skills and in particular look at sequencing of events. We will write in the role of the snail and recount her adventure. We will learn to use different sentence types, noun phrases for description, use commas within lists and link clauses using conjunctions. Non-fiction: We will learn about ocean-dwelling creatures and read information about the ocean. You will write short sequences of sentences, join two ideas within sentences using conjunctions 'and' and 'so'. Expanded noun phrases will be used to describe and specify creatures.		 Computing: Robot algorithms - inputting data to programme. Religious Education: We will learn about places and people that are sacred to Cornwall. We will visit Chacewater Church and understand the differences between Christianity and Judaism. RHSE: We will explore why people are special and how they care for and keep or another safe. Pupils will understand their responsibilities towards themselves and others as they get older, including the role they can play and the difference they can make within their communities.
