

Mathematics

Addition and Subtraction

Add and subtract numbers mentally, including:

- a three-digit number and ones
- a three-digit number and tens
- a three-digit number and hundreds



Multiplication and division

- recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables
- write and calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division using the multiplication tables that they know, including for two-digit numbers times one-digit numbers, using mental and progressing to formal written methods.

<u>English</u>

Text - Beasties by Jenny Nimmo

Outcome: Write their own creative story using a story see

History: Which was more impressive – the Stone Age or the Iron age?

We will be going back in time to study the changes in history from the Stone Age to the Iron Age and how life changed within these periods.

Art: Gestural Drawing with Charcoal

We will use charcoal to create a sense of drama/story telling and develop our understanding of how to use light and dark within our work.

Religious Education: What do Hindus believe God is like? 2.7

We will be discussing the different Deities in the Hindu religion, identifying the importance of their belief in the cycle of create/preserve and destroy and why this is important.

Computing: Stop-Frame Animation

Children will learn the skills to set up and create a storyboard. They will learn the importance of small changes to make each frame different and effective to create their own stop-frame animation.

We will be focusing on Fronted adverbials (with commas), Complex sentences, main and subordinate clauses including use of commas and Expanded noun phrases.
