Dear parents and carers,

Disco fever well and truly hit us in school this week! It has been brilliant to be able to do this and to see the excitement and anticipation in our children, in what, for some of our year groups, has been their first school disco experience! Elsewhere in school it has been a very busy week. NSPCC's *Speak out. Stay safe.*

I am pleased to tell you that next week we will be participating in the **NSPCC's *Speak out. Stay safe. online*** programme. This consists of an online assembly and supporting classroom based activities. *Speak out. Stay safe.* is a safeguarding programme available to all primary schools in the UK and Channel Islands. It aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse in a child friendly way. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a trusted adult or Childline.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast club has started and bookings can be made in the same way as we now do for Chatterbox, through Parent Pay (**last bookings by 3.15pm the day before**). The club runs from 7.45am through to the start of the school day and we are providing the children with a drink and a choice of cereal or toast (or both if they want!). It is being run by Mrs Dicker and Mr Smith and there is a session charge of £3.50 per day.



As you know we are starting this on a trial basis only. At the moment booking numbers are low and if this does remain the case over the next few weeks then it may not be viable for us to continue to offer this provision.

Children in Need – 19th November



Children in need is taking place next Friday, 19th November and we would like to support this very worthwhile cause. We do intend to keep it pretty simple this year and will have a non-uniform day which children can take part in and would welcome a £1 donation. 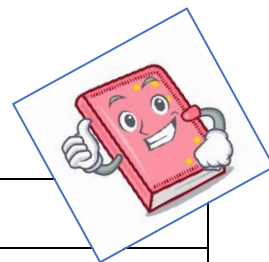
Website, Facebook and Photo Permissions

We are hoping to launch a refreshed version of our website at the end of next week or the beginning of the week after.
