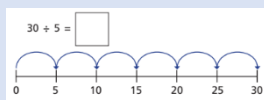
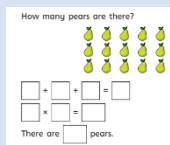
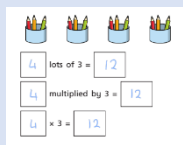
Class: Year 2 (Buds)

Theme: Sowing and Growing

On this page you will find an outline of our learning this half term in Buds

Maths:

- Multiplication - repeated addition on a number line as formal method
- Division - division as sharing and division as grouping (Y1 recap) - repeated subtraction on a number line as formal method
- Communicative properties of number - multiplication and division and a recap of formal methods of addition and subtraction
- Link back new skills to money and statistics (Graphs and bar charts)



Science: Plants

- Understand the differences and similarities between plants grown from seeds and bulbs.
- To understand the conditions that seeds require in order to germinate.
- To be able to find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy.

DT:

We will learn how to prepare vegetables and salads. Children will be able to create a salad dish and evaluate their product.

English:

Traditional Stories – Little Red Riding Hood

- Write own version of Little Red Riding Hood using a range of sentence types punctuated correctly (statement, question, exclamation, command)
- Past and present tense
- Choose verbs carefully to give precise information to the reader.
- Grammar: punctuating sentences (. , ! ?) and learning different sentence types (command, statement, question, sentence).



Computing: We will be working on Pictograms this term, understanding how to interpret data and represent it digitally.

Religious Education:

This term we will be learning all about Easter and why it is important to Christians.

RSHE:

This sequence of lessons will be exploring the importance and diversity of families, and healthy, positive family relationships.

PE:

Outside: Tennis Net Games

Inside: Dynamic and static balance practise, applying these skills in balance circuits

Music:

We are going to learn how to play the xylophone! We will focus on high and low pitch and how to read the letters to create our very own piece.

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HOME LEARNING

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Theme: Sowing and Growing

Alongside regular reading, spelling and maths home learning choose at least one of the following to complete over this half term. You might even be inspired and choose more than one!

Plant a seed or a bulb and observe how it grows. Make a diary about what happens overtime. What does it need to survive? Where is the best place to plant it?



Fieldwork

Go for a walk in one of your local areas (woods, beach, town) and write a list of the human and physical features you can see. How does this compare to another local place?

In DT, we will be making healthy salads. What healthy dish can you make at home? Write the recipe and instructions about how to make it. Write a shopping list of the ingredients you need.

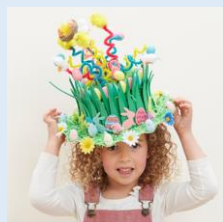
Make a puppet or stick puppet of a traditional story character. You could also make a natural 'journey stick' to show the adventures your characters go on.
