Mathematics

Multiplication and Division

- identify multiples and factors
- establish whether a number up to 100 is prime and recall prime numbers up to 19
- multiply and divide whole numbers and those involving decimals by 10, 100 and 1,000
- recognise and use square numbers and cube numbers



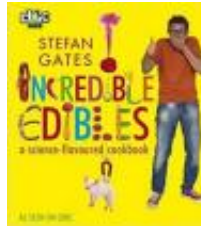
Calculation

- Multiply a 4-digit number by a 2-digit number
- Divide a 4-digit number by a 1-digit number
- Divide with remainders
- Solve problems with multiplication and division

English

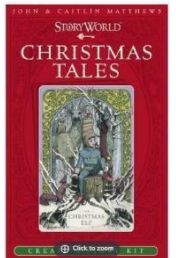
Book: **Incredible Edibles**

Religious Education:

Understand that we all have strengths and weaknesses, and that we should celebrate our individual strengths and talents.

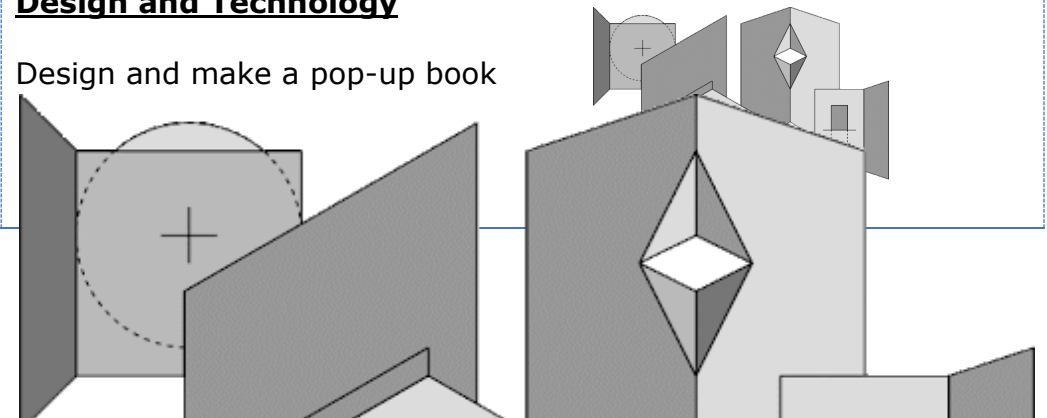
Create future goals and show an understanding of how these can be achieved
